Why three separate target statements?

It is important that pupils are set targets that are both challenging and attainable based on their own ability in that subject.

All of our teachers are given broad boundaries for every pupil based on English/Maths KS2 data.

Each teacher can then use their own baseline testing to decide whether the overall A/I/F judgement arising from KS2 data is appropriate for their own subject.

This is why pupils may have, for example, an Intermediate target statement in one subject and a more challenging Advanced target statement in another.

If by the end of the year a pupil is consistently Exceeding their statements in one particular subject, the teacher may decide to change that pupil's target statements to more challenging ones in the future.

EFFORT & CONCERNS

The final two columns on the interim report are with regard to how well a pupil has applied themselves. The options for teachers here are:

CONCERNS

- Motivation
- Behaviour
- Homework



 At present your son/daughter has some way to go in attaining the targets described in the statement.
